

- There's safety in numbers. Don't let your children go out unattended. Travel together or in groups and plan the route ahead to keep everyone on track.
- Stay with your crew. Never accept rides from strangers. Don't let anyone wander off.
- Be seen! Carry flashlights, wear brightly coloured costumes, or add your own reflective tape so motorists can spot you and your children.
- Know what your kids are eating. Inspect all candy and treats. Throw out treats with a broken or damaged seal.
- Avoid the street. Walk on sidewalks or the gravel edge of the road to stay safe.

- Look before you cross. Check before you cross driveways or roads.
 Motorists may not be able to see you.
- Avoid trips and falls. Ensure costumes fit properly and hem long garments that may cause a tripping hazard. Make sure that masks do not block the view or breathing. Cut eye and nose holes larger if needed.
- Wear proper footwear. Shoes should be comfortable, warm and have good tread.
- Wear a jacket under your costume. Dress smart. If the weather is cold, add layers.
- Only stop in well-lit homes. Stay clear of dark houses.
