

# WINTER CAR SURVIVAL KIT

Portable phone charger. Make sure to charge it every once in awhile to make sure the battery isn't dead.

You need washer fluid more in winter months. Have a back-up in case you run low on the road.

Double check your spare tire is in good condition.
