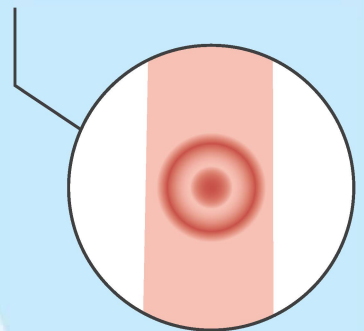

Deer Ticks carrying Lyme Disease:

- 15-20% of nymphs
- 50% of adult females

Canada reported **500 CASES** of Lyme Disease in 2014, but expects **10,000 CANADIANS** will be infected **ANNUALLY** by 2020.

If a **bullseye rash** appears after a tick bite, seek medical attention.



Where do ticks live?

- Areas where white-tailed deer dwell
- Wooded areas
- Trails in forests
- Trails in suburban areas
